

YOUTH EMPOWERED TO TEACH PEERS
Interactive Porn, Bondage, Domination, Sadomasochism (BDSM)



The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is training and recruiting students to instruct their peers in sensitive and complex subjects such as HIV/Aids, mental health, gender identity/confusion, suicide counseling, contraception, condomology, asexuality, porn, sexual pleasure, sexting and even teledildonics.

Below are a sampling of workshops held at Oregon's annual [Adolescent Sexuality Conference](#) (ASC) held in Seaside, Oregon where nearly 1/3rd of the attendees are youth. Several workshops were led by teens using role play in sexuality behaviors and choices.

During the 2014 ASC, youth were empowered by attending workshops such as: "No Glove, No Love: Condomology 411". Teens learn to train interactively as shown in the following videos: [Condom Demo](#), [Condom Lineup](#), [Condomology](#), and [Dental Dams](#).

Keynote Speaker, Cory Silverberg, co-founder of Toronto, Canada Sex Toy/Pleasure Shop, "Come As You Are" (www.comeasyouare.com) led a workshop titled "From Texting to Teledildonics: Is Technology Changing Sex?"

Cory Silverberg directed students on how to use [interactive pornography](#) and how to [form your identity using Avatars](#). He also instructed them on the [use of sex toys over the internet](#) where, "...You can experiment with sex that is against the rules (ie: BDSM experiences) and what this looks like". Silverberg went on to state that, "What's amazing...your partner feels what you are doing. You can watch each other via Skype, Smart Phone, or Blue Tooth. It makes it very exciting!"

At the 2013 Oregon Adolescent Sexuality Conference, one workshop was entitled, “You Say Porn, I Say Porn”, was led by youth who lead discussions and provided “insights” into all aspects of porn.

A major goal of these annual ASC conferences is to empower teen voices through organizations such as Teen Council, Youth Action Councils, Youth Advisory Councils, Teen Outreach Program, and the Peer Education Institute which is now in nine states including Oregon. Much of the training to Oregon youth is provided by [Planned Parenthood Columbia Willamette, Planned Parenthood of Southwestern Oregon and Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest](#).

In July, 2014, Planned Parenthood Columbia Willamette (PPCW) was exposed giving advice to a 15 yr. old on sadomasochism — this was in their [Clackamas, Oregon office](#). PPCW (along with the Oregon Department of Education and the Oregon Health Authority) is on the Oregon Adolescent Sexuality Conference [Steering Committee](#).

Oregon School Based Health Alliance (formerly School-Based Health Centers) offers youth scholarships to attend the ASC to receive training in sexuality behavior and choices, and training on how to advocate for SBHCs. These youth, often members of Youth Advisory Council (YAC), will return to schools to “educate” their peers.

The Oregon Department of Education, which is on the Adolescent Sexuality Conference Steering Committee, supports youth teaching youth, despite the fact that these teens are not qualified nor licensed to teach and are not accountable for consequences of this agenda-driven education. Peer educators are encouraged to fundraise, market and to affect public policy. Parents' rights and local control are ignored and over-stepped.

When a parent or guardian drops off their child at school and school doors close, they have trust and confidence that highly trained qualified adults will be leading classroom education. Peer Education around such sensitive issues should not be promoted or supported by the Oregon Department of Education.
